

Greetings Former Indian Princess/Guides Dads,


The Kettering Indian Princess and Guide Programs were established in order to foster a strong and lasting bond between fathers and their daughters/sons; *Friends Always, Pals Forever*. The Programs were based on a set of six Aims which taught the importance of the relationship between fathers and daughters/sons, respect for each other and your family and the need to support your community through service projects and volunteering. We (dads/daughters/sons) have all benefited from the Princess, Guide, Wanderers and Guides+ programs over the years. As our daughters/sons grow older and prepare to move on with their lives we have been thinking of a way to extend the benefits and create a lasting legacy for the programs.


To that end; **The Chief's Scholarship** is being established to recognize and benefit graduating high school seniors who had graduated from the Kettering Indian Princess and Guide Programs. The intent is to raise sufficient funds and distribute a minimum of four scholarships on a yearly basis to seniors graduating from Alter or Fairmont High Schools (one to a former Princess and Guide at each school). The goal is to award the first Chief's Scholarships in May of 2007. (We will start with just Alter and Fairmont and consider expanding to include Centerville, Bellbrook, Springboro, etc once we get the program off the ground). Initially the amount of the scholarships will be in the \$750 range but could increase depending upon the growth of the fund. The eligibility requirements are still being finalized and we hope to have them published in the near future; they are sure to include items such as a minimum GPA, community service activity, etc.

The Chief's Scholarship Fund will be managed by the Dayton Foundation and promoted through the Kettering Education Foundation. Initially a charitable checking account will be set up with the Dayton Foundation until we get ready to award the first scholarships, at which point the checking account will be converted into an endowed scholarship fund. The advantage of starting with a charitable checking account is that there is no management fee; once it is converted to an endowed scholarship fund there is an annual management fee of 1% of the value of the fund. The Dayton Foundation will manage the funds and disbursements and even select the scholarship winners based on our criteria.


Our goal is to raise approximately \$50,000 to establish a self supporting Endowed Scholarship Fund capable distributing \$3,000+ in scholarships on an annual basis. We are already off to a good start with a corporate pledge from National City Bank in the amount of \$1,000. **We are now asking you to consider donating generously to the Chief's Scholarship Fund. However, if we are to meet our goal we need you also to actively seek corporate donations from your employers and business contacts. Since the donations will be made through the Dayton Foundation to The Chief's Scholarship Fund they will be completely tax deductible.** In addition, we plan on having annual fund raisers; ideas include a Dads campout at Camp Kern, golf outing, dinner party, ect. Our first fund raiser and official kick off will be an informal reception and tour of the new Trent Arena on Sunday, December 4 from 2:00 - 4:00. Donating to the Chief's Scholarship Fund will entitle you to automatic membership in the Old Chief's Club which will have a monthly business/social meeting on the third Tuesday of each month beginning at 7:30 at Harrigans Pub. An attendance fee of \$5.00 will be assessed at each meeting which will go directly into the scholarship fund. Enclosed in this mailing is a pledge form that can be used for both personal and corporate donations.
